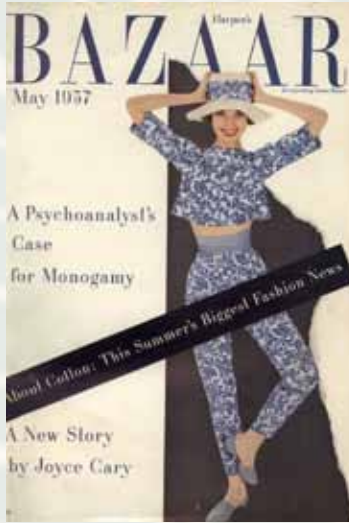
So spruce up for spring with these tips:

# Hunt & Gather an April Bouquet

Indians who loved the rich colors and multi-layered details of the millefiore beads. These hand crafted trade beads are sometimes mistaken for cloisonné which is an enameling technique on a metal foundation rather than a gathering of glass cane flowers.

For those who covet the finest enameling as seen in Cartier's Mystery Clocks and the Faberge jeweled eggs, gather a cluster of *guilloche* French enameled brooches as shown here. The

While bright daffodils may be the only thing blooming in your garden, consider the rainbow of flower alternatives available at the Point. Flora and fauna are the ideal seasonal collectible that will never fall out of fashion or favor. From 19th Century hand-painted Staffordshire porcelains and vintage transfer plates, to a full array of antique glass, enamel, metal, ivory, Bakelite, sterling and carved wood there is a flower option for every collector. Accessorizing your home and wardrobe with flowers adds casual splendor to your day! The flower of the month is “Sweet Pea” which blooms constantly and thus guarantees lasting pleasure. According to Victorian floriography, the sweet pea's riotous, curly tendrils and richly colored blooms are an emblem of careless luxury.

If casual fun suits your style, then hunt for the big painted enamel Flower Power pins from the 1960's or the whimsical carved wood and bone brooches of the 1940's. For the more refined collector, the colorful glass Tutti Frutti necklaces of the 1930's are a rare find in good condition, fun to wear and a safe investment. The delicate glass lampwork components come in flower, fruit, leaf and bird motifs clustered together in beaded chokers. These sculptured works of art are usually attributed to Italian artisans but the Bohemians developed their own version of glass flowers and the French followed with pastel plastic assemblages. Venetian artisans are credited with perfecting millefiore (a thousand flowers) mosaic glass beads in the early 1800's



French mastered this labor intensive technique of high-fired transparent colored enamel applied repeatedly over a machine-engraved patterned metal background. Ornate engraved sterling or gold mounts became lace pins, sash and bouquet pins in the *belle époque* (beautiful era) around the turn of the century. Finely cut gold flowers were inlaid in some of these enameled masterpieces that can still be found today for less than one hundred dollars.

Bold Art Deco and Retro Moderne costume jewelry often featured large scale painted pot metal and paste bouquets and floral basket themes. Plus the butterflies, dragonflies, bees and spiders that love to buzz around your garden have been favorite clothing ornaments since the Art Nouveau period.

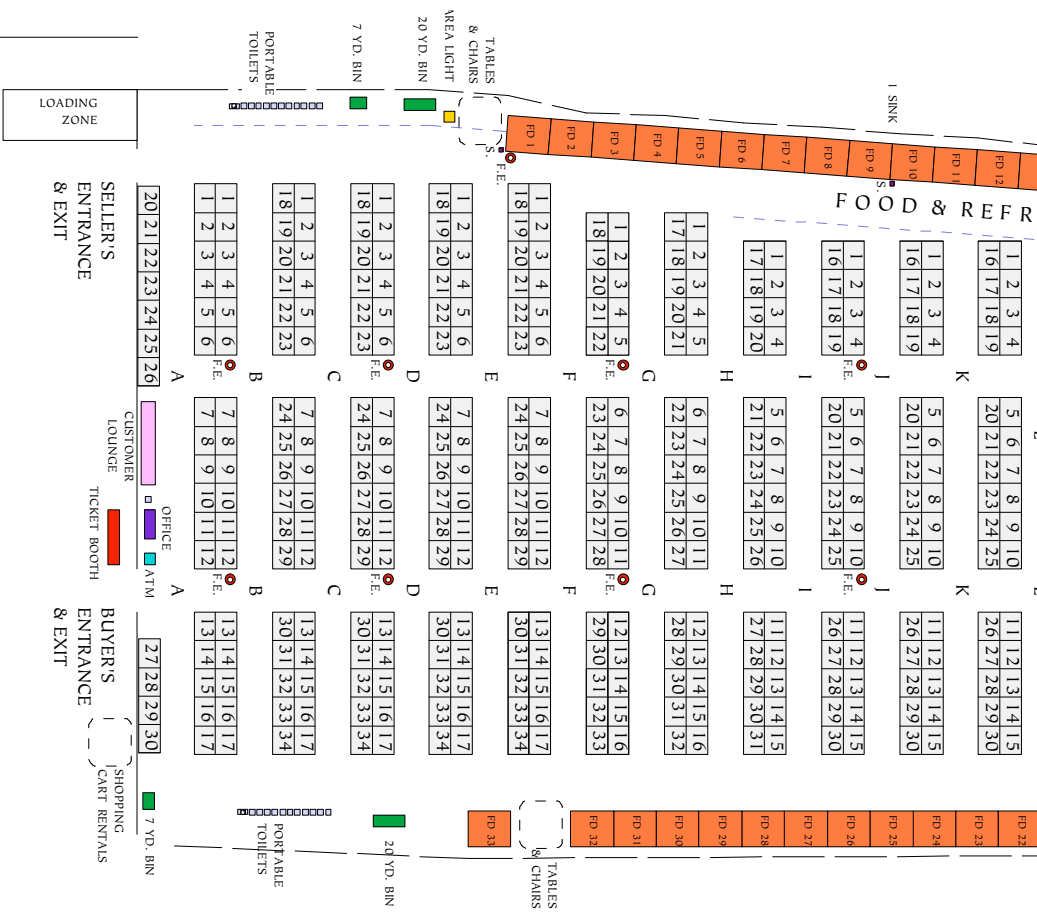

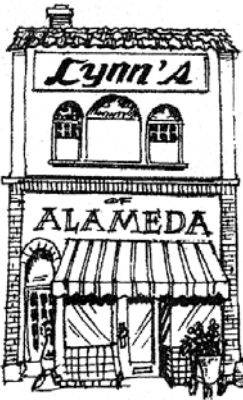

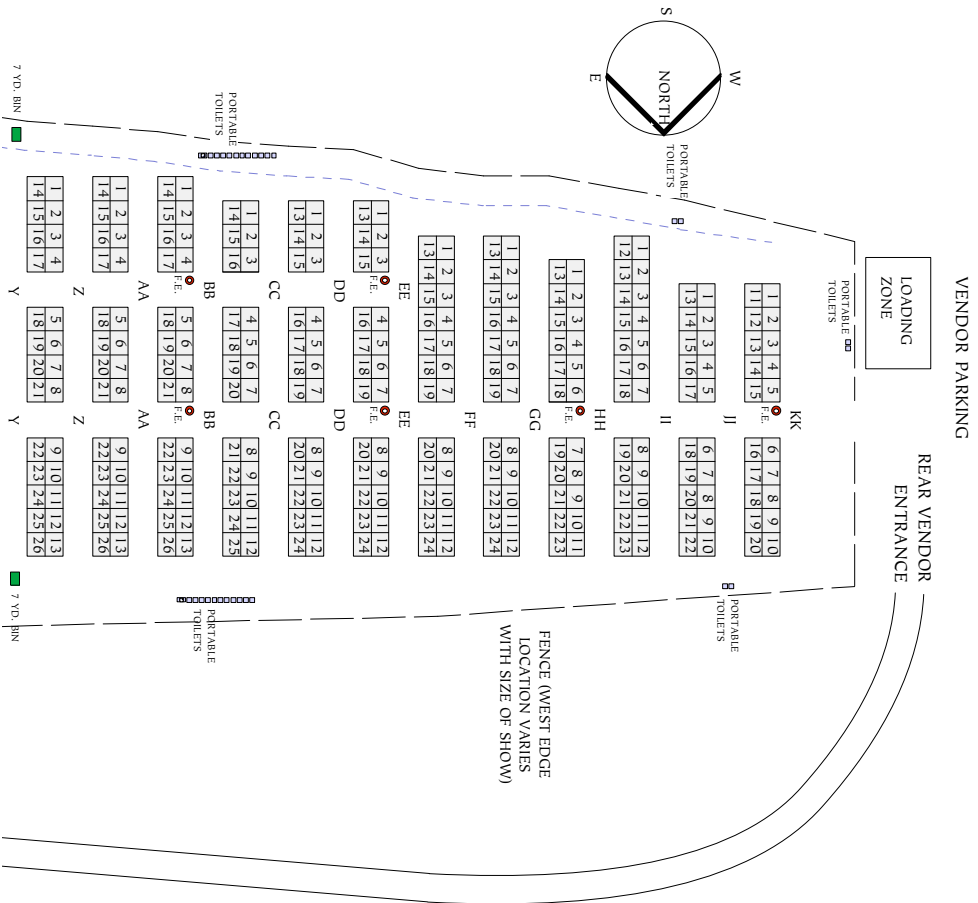

## HONOLULU LADY - In Search of Paradise

Traveling from the Pacific Coast to Hawaii, over an ocean that turns from gray to steel blue and then to greener and lighter tones reflective of the coral reefs beneath you soon see an amazing island on the horizon....or could this be Alameda Point on the return trip?

According to legend, Polynesians from Marguesas and Tahiti crossed the uncharted ocean in large sailing canoes and landed in Hawaii with their families 1,200 years ago. They made tapa cloth, grass houses, outrigger canoes and Tiki carvings.

When Captain Cook discovered the Hawaiian islands in 1778, he found each of them to be its own separate Kingdom. By 1810, King Kamehameha had brought all of the islands under his domain. His descendants ruled until 1894, when Hawaii became a republic. The United States annexed the islands in 1898 and made them a territory in 1900 and a State on March 12, 1959.

Japanese, Chinese, Hawaiians Filipinos, Samoans, Portugues Korean, Pueto Rican have mixed their ethnic composition which is the object of many a guessing game. The wave of tourists and new residents to the territory rearranged Hawaiian society. Still, the "locals" know a "Haole" when they see one.

You hear a lot about the Aloha Spirit, the carry over of the generous, unpretentious, carefree behavior of the first Polynesians. You get the feeling that everyone knows everyone else or at least knows someone who does. You are struck by a positive leveling effect ... people are pretty much the same in muumuus and Aloha Shirts.

Collectable memorabilia from the islands (Hawaiiana) has become increasingly difficult to find. The lure of exotic drinks and playful companionship at Tiki Central, Tiki Oasis, etc. has also inspired collectors. For three summers, Donna and Rosie hauled their collections to Pomona College where they gave seminars on Hawaiiana at the annual Southern California Collector's Conference .

## "Brooching" the Subject of Spring

Spring is upon us; there's no better time to reinvent yourself and your look. Michaan's Auctions Jewelry Department carries pieces in its April sale that celebrate the spirit of the season. Take a fun departure from standard fashion jewelry looks with a novelty animal brooch that is light in spirit but substantial in quality.



A trio of brooches will be offered on Sunday, April the 1st echoing the delightful creatures and colors of spring. Lot 143 is an adorable sparrow pin, suitable for a young lady or the young at heart. The bird in flight features forty-six round and oval aquamarines weighing a total of approximately 5.75 carats. The aquamarines are then accented by thirteen rose cut diamonds weighing a total of approximately 0.25 carats. Garnet eyes and a 14k yellow gold setting finish the dainty sparrow, estimated at \$700-1,000.

For those who prefer a bolder look, lot 176 is a fine choice. The salamander brooch measures 5 1/2 inches long by 2 inches wide, even larger than many species of the genuine article. The body of the animal is made of approximately one hundred oval and round sapphire cabochons accented by sixty-six rose cut diamonds. Two ruby cabochons are then used to fashion the amphibians eyes. All of the stones are set in silver gilt with the piece being completed by a 14k yellow gold pin stem (\$2,500-3,000).

Lastly is a gorgeous multi-stone dragonfly brooch featured as lot 141 (\$2,500-3,000). The dragonfly form was commonly used for Art Nouveau jewelry and this piece is a fresh and modern take on the theme. Ninety-six pear, oval and round blue zircons encrust the insect with two oval sapphires forming the eyes. The entire brooch is then completed by one hundred and eleven round and rose cut diamonds. All of the stones are set in silver gilt with a 14k yellow gold pin stem.

The pieces will be up for auction on April the 1st at Michaan's main gallery located at 2751 Todd Street, Alameda, CA 94501 with bidding to commence at 10:00 a.m. Lots will be available for preview from March the 30th until the day of sale.

## What's It Worth?

Doctor Gary Tucker is a huge fan of the movies. He loves movies so much that he designed his 10 chair dental office in Fremont to have the feel of an old time movie house. His office featured a huge curved glass wall; toothbrushes and toothpaste were displayed in an old candy counter; the popcorn machine churned out healthy, sugar-free snacks.

Doctor Tucker's patients frequently brought him finds to decorate his office. These finds might include movie posters or lobby cards, movie memorabilia or props. Decades ago one of his patients presented him with a prized bit of movie memorabilia – a 12 inch high Bakelite statue of Ava Gardner as Venus.

Ava Gardner (1922-1990) was an American actress who signed a contract with MGM Studios in 1941. In 1948 she starred in the titular role of Venus in the film production, "One Touch of Venus." In this role she played an ancient statue placed in a department store window for publicity; a window dresser (Eddie Hatch, played by Robert Walker) accidentally brings her to life when he plants a playful kiss on the statue's cheek.

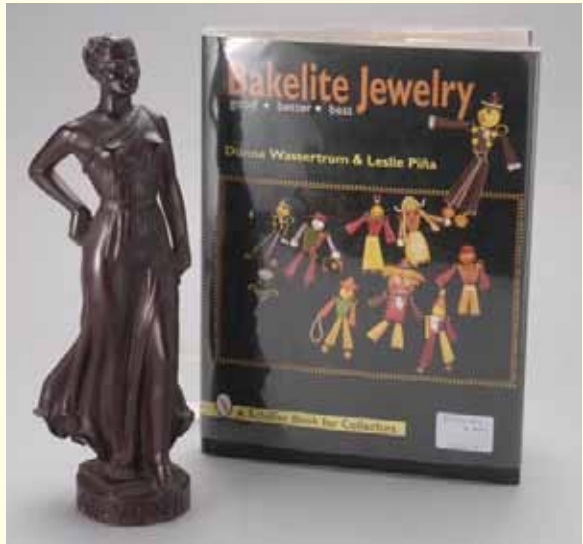
To achieve a realistic looking statue to come to life, MGM sent Gardner to sculptor Joseph Nicolosi to pose. The legend contends that Miss Gardner posed in a bikini but the sculptor was displeased with the drape of the fabric. After several drinks she removed

her top and Nicolas continued with his sculpture. Evidently some mis-communication occurred between the sculptor and the studio: when Nicolosi presented his nude Venus to MGM bosses they were incensed: no one had explained to Nicolosi that the model needed to be sculpted as is she were draped in Grecian robes. Nicolas, under protest, sculpted robes for the statue.

After going through such lengths to achieve verisimilitude between actress and sculpture, the studio decided to cash in on their efforts. They had a model of the Nicolosi sculpture made in Bakelite. These statues were presented as promotional items to theatre owners and members of the press.

I contacted archivists at MGM studios to see if I could learn how many of these were produced but never heard back from them. I can say in my 15 years of auctions and appraisals this is the first one I've come across. After some digging I found records of one having sold at auction recently for just over \$400.

Although she earned no awards for this performance, it is One Touch of Venus that solidified Miss Gardner's unearthly beauty in the minds of her fans. Dr. Tucker, after years of keeping Fremont's smiles bright, retired from his practice and dismantled his movie theatre office. He has consigned his Bakelite statue of Ava Gardner as Venus to Michaan's April 1st Estate Auction.

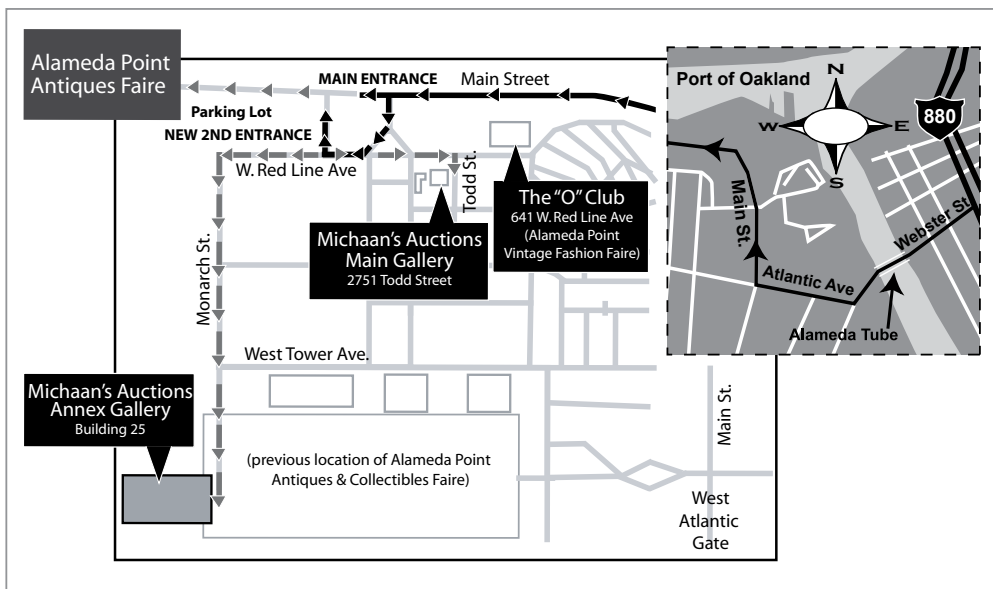
